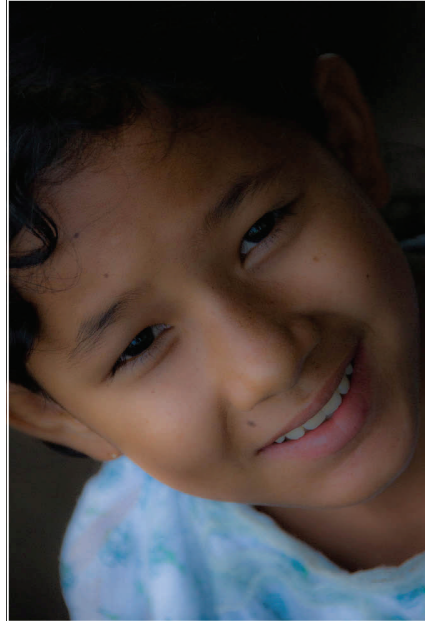

**Central Asia Institute's** work was started in 1993 by Greg Mortensen (*Three Cups of Tea*). As of 2009, Central Asia Institute has successfully established 130 schools in Pakistan and Afghanistan, which provide (or have provided) education to over 51,000 students, with an emphasis on girls' education. A few additional projects have been in Mongolia (rural health education) and Kyrgyzstan (teacher training scholarships).
